- The Class A license will permit the establishments to sell liquor in sealed packages to be consumed off premises. The city only has one Class A license available which is currently authorized to Circle K.
- It was consensus of the committee to allow the city to add two (2) more Class A Liquor License and let these establishments be granted with the Class A License. The current number of Class G Liquor License, which is what Newton Foods and Marathon currently hold, will not change. There will simply now be two more Class G Liquor License available in Newton, which allows the sale of beer and wine in sealed packages to be consumed off premises.
